

WAX RECOMMENDATION **TOKO**[®]

Tour of Anchorage

Sunday, March 8

8:30 A.M., 50K/40K start at Service High School

9:30 A.M., 25K Classic start at Russian Jack

10 A.M., 25K Skate start at Russian Jack

Wave start

All races finish at Kincaid Park

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low 5 to 15 above. Sunday high in the 20s. Recent snow has made for good conditions. Possible additional accumulation this week. The race always starts cold and warms up on the way to Kincaid.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly, scrape and brush, then for the 50K and 40K apply HF Red/HF Blue mixed 1:1, scrape and brush. For the 25K, apply HF Red, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Blue (50K/40K) or Jetstream Red (25K), brush with a dedicated nylon polishing brush and polish with a thermopad.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 120 grit sandpaper, iron in Carbon BaseWax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Check at the TOKO tent for updated grip wax recommendation.

Structure: A fine linear structure or universal structure, covered by one pass with the fine-linear wheel of a TOKO structurite tool (before JetStream application) will best suit these conditions.

Check the WaxTip page at www.TokoUS.com before all of your races for the latest waxing information. The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
