

WAX RECOMMENDATION



The Great Ski Race

Tahoe Cross Country Center, Tahoe, CA

Sunday March 2

30K Skate

Race Start 9:00 AM

Point-To-Point

Forecast/Conditions: Saturday night 30% chance of snow showers, low 16-20 F on course. Sunday sunny, high 42-46 F. Race start temp. low 30s F.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly scrape and brush, then apply HF Red, (If expected finish time is sub 2hrs. If longer mix HF Red/HF Yellow, 2:1) scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Moly, brushing with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and finally, polish with a thermopad. HelX Warm would make an excellent alternative to JetStream in this case.

Gripwax: NA

Structure: A universal structure, on a medium-stiff ski, with one pass from the fine linear wheel of a TOKO Structurerite tool (Skiers expecting 2+Hrs, use coarse linear wheel, on a medium flexing ski) will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (HelX, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork at the expense of durability.
