

WAX RECOMMENDATION



10th Mountain Biathlon

Auburn Ski Club, Soda Springs, CA

Sunday April 13

10:00 am Race Start

6Km or 9Km Freestyle

Forecast/Conditions: Current Conditions: Transformed snow with a little fresh mixed in. Dirty. Forecast: Warming trend, no precip. Saturday: Low of 30F, High of 60F! Sunday: Low of 30F, race 34F, high 60F, Sunny, Light Breeze.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly scrape and brush, then apply HF Moly/HF Yellow, mixed 1:1, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Moly, brushing with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and finally, polish with a thermopad. HelX Warm would make an excellent alternative to JetStream in this case.

Gripwax: NA

Structure: A fine linear structure, covered by one pass with the coarse-linear wheel, then one pass with the coarse non-linear wheel of a TOKO structurite tool, (before JetStream application) will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (HelX, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork at the expense of durability.
