

WAX RECOMMENDATION **TOKO**[®]

Great Bear Chase

Swedetown Ski Trails, Calumet, MI

Sunday, March 8

9 A.M., 26K Classic, 1 lap

9:20 A.M., 50K/26K Skate, 2/1 lap

NOTE TIME CHANGE: Daylight Savings Time starts March 8

Forecast/Conditions: Mostly cloudy overnight with a low around 10. Cloudy with a 40 percent chance of snow after 1 P.M. Race time temperature 14 to 23 and winds steady at 15 mph gusting to 20. Recent warmth and liquid precipitation will transform snow and sustained warm temperatures should firm into a solid track.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly, scrape and brush, then apply HF Blue, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Blue, brushing with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and polish with a thermopad.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Carbon BaseWax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 1-2 layers of Carbon GripWax Blue depending on ski stiffness and race distance. Cork each layer smooth, and apply 2-3 additional layers of Carbon White. Earliest 50k skiers may consider alternating Blue/White layers to accommodate multiple laps.

Structure: A fine linear structure will best suit these conditions.

Check the WaxTip page at www.TokoUS.com before all of your races for the latest waxing information. The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
