

# WAX RECOMMENDATION **TOKO**<sup>®</sup>

## Michigan HS Championships Pursuit

Michigan Tech Nordic Training Center, Houghton, MI

Saturday, February 14

10 A.M., 6.4K/3.2K Classic, Interval start (2/1 laps)

2:30 P.M., 6.4K Skate, Gunderson start (2 laps)

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low in high teens. Start time temperature 20 for morning race and rising to 27 for afternoon start. Expect machine tilled and packed trail consisting of transformed and new snow. Classic track will glaze from humidity and number of laps.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly, scrape and brush for both morning and afternoon races. Apply HF Blue/HF Red mixed 1:1, scrape and brush for the morning; HF Red for the afternoon. Rotocork JetStream Blue in the morning and JetStream Red in the afternoon, brush with a dedicated nylon polishing brush and polish with a thermopad.

Gripwax Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Carbon BaseWax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 2-3 layers of Carbon GripWax Viola, corking between layers. Those needing more kick should use Carbon Red.

Structure: A fine linear structure covered by 1-2 passes with the fine-linear wheel of a TOKO structurite tool (before JetStream application) will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
