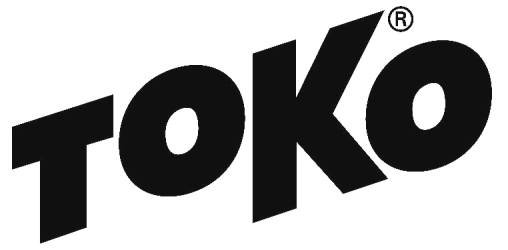


# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## Big Bay Honey Bear Classic

Big Bay, MI

Saturday, February 16

15K & 30K Classic @ 12:30PM

Forecast/Conditions: Expect machine worked and packed powder with a firm track due to the cold temperatures Thursday and Friday following the fresh snow. **Friday Night**...Partly cloudy, with a low around -3. **Saturday**...Mostly cloudy with an afternoon high of around 21.

Glidewax: Apply a mixture of LF Moly/LF Blue, scrape and brush. Then apply HF Blue, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking Jetstream Moly, brushing afterwards with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and finally, polish with a Thermopad.

Gripwax: Sand kick zone lightly with 150 grit sandpaper. Apply Toko Base Green, heat and spread with a synthetic cork. Cover with 2-3 layers of Toko Carbon White. Those needing extra kick should use Toko Carbon Blue.

Structure: A fine linear stonegrind will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (HelX, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork as the expense of durability.
