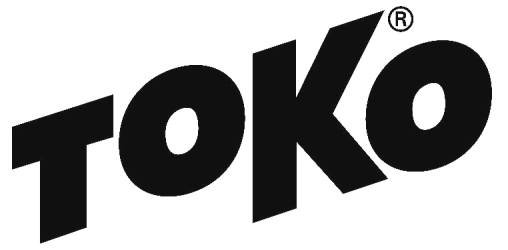


# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## Lotvola Cup

Maplelag Resort, Callaway, MN

Sunday, March 2

12K Classic @ 1pm

### Forecast/Conditions:

**Saturday**...Mostly sunny with an afternoon high around 33.

**Saturday night**...Mostly cloudy with a 20% chance of snow with a low around 21. **Sunday**...Mostly cloudy with an afternoon high around 33.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly, scrape and brush. Then apply HF Red, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking Jetstream High Speed, brushing afterwards with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and finally, polish with a Thermopad.

Gripwax: Sand kick zone lightly with 150 grit sandpaper. Apply Toko Base Green, heat and spread with a synthetic cork. Cover with 2-3 layers of Toko Carbon Viola. Those needing extra kick should use Toko Carbon Red.

Structure: A universal to warm universal stonegrind will best suit these conditions. 1 pass with the course broken structure bit of the Structurite tool can be used to add desired structure.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (Helix, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork as the expense of durability.
