

WAX RECOMMENDATION **TOKO**[®]

Great Bear Chase

Calumet, MI

DON'T FORGET DAYLIGHT SAVINGS

Forecast/Conditions: Newly fallen lake-effect powder mixed with older transformed and sugar. Weather Forecast/Expected Conditions: Saturday And Saturday Night...A 20 percent chance of snow showers. Mostly cloudy. Highs around 17. Lows 4 to 9 above inland to around 11 at the shore. Sunday And Sunday Night...Warmer. Partly cloudy. Highs around 26. Lows around 17.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly/ LF Blue, scrape and brush, then apply HF Blue, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Moly, brushing with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and finally, polish with a thermopad.

Gripwax: Roughen kick zone with 180 grit sandpaper, and iron in TOKO base Green Binder. Cover with TOKO Carbon Gripwax Blue (2 layers) covered by 1 layer of Carbon White (26K) and 3 layers Blue, covered by 2 layers White for 50K skiers.

Structure: One pass with the fine linear wheel of a TOKO Structurite tool, will best suit these conditions.

Racing - Service

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (HelIX, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork at the expense of durability.
