Forecast/Conditions: Friday night, 50 percent chance of snow showers, low around 20. Saturday, mostly sunny with a high near 31. Saturday night, partly cloudy with a low around 12. Sunday, mostly sunny with a high near 29.

Glidewax: Saturday early starters should use Red/Yellow mixed 1:1, later starters use Yellow. Sunday early starters use Red, later Red/Yellow mixed 1:1, and last groups use Yellow. For higher performing wax, use LF or HF. And for fastest skis, top coat with JetStream Red early and JS Yellow later.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Carbon BaseWax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 2-3 layers of Carbon GripWax Viola or Red in the early hours, corking between layers. Try Carbon Yellow or Silver for later starters.

Structure: Coarse linear and non-linear for later starters.

**Racing - Service**

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
