

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## Prospect 2010 Olympics

Woodford, VT

Saturday, February 6

9 A.M. registration, 10 A.M. Opening Ceremonies.

Numerous events including Lollipop, Classic Sprints, Obstacle Course, 4 or 7.5 k ski to find pipe cleaners and assemble Olympic Rings, Memory Course, XC Giant Slalom. Whole family invited.

Forecast/Conditions: Friday night low of 8F. Saturday high near 21. Partly sunny. Great skiing reported.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly, scrape and brush, then apply System 3 Blue/Red mixed 1:1, scrape and brush. Blue/Red mix recommended to cover rising temperatures during the day.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Carbon BaseWax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 2+ layers of Carbon GripWax Blue for early events and Viola for later events.

Structure: A fine linear grind covered by one pass with the Blue TOKO Structurite tool (old fine-linear wheel) before JetStream application will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
