

WAX RECOMMENDATION **TOKO**[®]

Saturday March 2

Race Start: 9:00 Lollipop event and 9:30 to 2:30

Classic Sprint relays

6k Lap; J5 - 1 lap each skier; J4 - 2 alternating laps each skier; J3 - 3 alternating laps each skier

Forecast/Conditions: Saturday: A chance of snow showers. Mostly cloudy, with a high near 36. Chance of precipitation is 40%. Saturday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 13. Sunday: Mostly sunny, with a high near 37.

Glidewax: Whether using Toko System 3, Low Fluoro, or High Fluor skiers should following these guidelines: early starters should prepare their skate skis with Blue and Red mixed 1:1. Later skiers will want to apply warmer wax, such as Red, and latest skiers will want to mix Red and Yellow. All skis should be thoroughly scraped and brushed. For speed at all costs, Jet Stream HighSpeed will work well.

Gripwax: Sand grip zone lightly with 180 grit sandpaper; for early starters (J3's) apply thin layer of Toko Base Green as binder and cork until very smooth; for early starters (J3's), Carbon Viola hard wax will work. Later starters (J5's) will be needing Orange Klister.

Structure: A universal structure will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (HelX, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork at the expense of durability.
