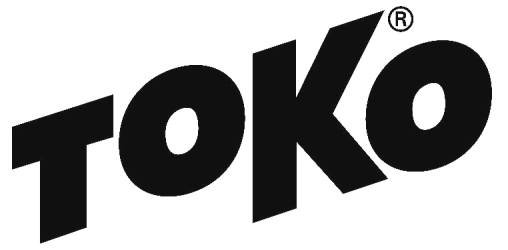


WAX RECOMMENDATION



Eastern J2 Championships and National Invitational

Jackson Ski Touring Foundation, Jackson, NH
Saturday March 8

10:00 am individual 5k classic, seeded wave starts; 2:00 pm 1.2k classic sprint seeded wave starts.

Forecast/Conditions: **Friday Night:** Snow likely, mainly after 1am. Cloudy, with a low around 19. Chance of precipitation is 60%.

Saturday: Snow likely, mixing with freezing rain after 1pm. Cloudy, with a high near 30. Chance of precipitation is 60%.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly scrape and brush, then apply HF Red, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream HighSpeed, brushing with a dedicated nylon polishing brush, and finally, polish with a thermopad.

Gripwax: Roughen kick zone with 180 grit sandpaper, and iron in TOKO base Green Binder. Cover with TOKO Carbon Gripwax Blue or Viola (10AM.) For 2PM, depending upon temperature and precipitation, working grips could be klister, klister covered with hard wax, or if it is snowing and near 32F – no wax and hairies.

Structure: A fine (AM), and coarse linear (PM) structure will best suit these conditions.

The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes available, skip the Fluorocarbon (HelIX, JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red, Blue). Additionally, for those who do not have a rotocork (for applying JetStream), this step can be replaced by vigorously corking with a dedicated Plasto Cork at the expense of durability.
